## When Memorial Contributions are Requested

As part of making funeral arrangements, family members sometimes designate a charity or other organization to receive financial contributions given in memory of the deceased. Often this request is made "in lieu of flowers."

Those who honor their loved ones with charitable contributions rarely want a service completely devoid of flowers. Using the "in lieu of flowers" phrase runs the risk of just that. Please consider avoiding this phrase in the death notices you write.

It is possible to recommend donations without a negative reference to flowers. For example, "The family suggests memorial contributions be made to ...." eliminates the reference and honors the family's request.
