## Salt-Blast Technique



START with überfrost, baking soda and a clean vessel of choice.



Apply überfrost 8" away to a section of the glass.



Immediately sprinkle baking soda onto the wet überfrost.



Repeat 1 & 2 to cover all areas. Let dry. Topcoat with überfrost.

## Spray Tips"

- · Chilled baking soda creates more texture variance. Store baking soda in the freezer before using.
- Use überfrost as a clear ultra-matte finish on non-glass surfaces to quickly change glossy colors to matte.
- Make shiny metallic finishes matte with 2 light coats of überfrost.
- Try the Salt-Blast finish on non-glass surfaces (see gold plastic urn, right).
- Mask a pattern in painters' tape to create stunning effects (see right).
- Decorative Finishes on Glass are best not stored in refrigeration. Advise cooler storing bouquets in stock vases. Before delivery transfer to the customized vase readied with fresh water. Bonus: no sweaty vase and clean presentation to recipient.
